What is Advanced Placement?

Advance Placement (AP) is a program that allows high school students to study university-level course content in grades 11 and 12, offering them high standards in education university preparation. Students taking AP courses are eligible to earn first-year university credits.

Who should take AP?

AP is appropriate for any academic student who wants to challenge themselves and gain university experience in a high school setting. Lively offers students focussed support in Biology, English Literature, European History and Calculus but students are eligible to study any of AP's 26 subject areas.

Advantages of AP:
